California Science Center - Admission to the Science Center's permanent exhibition galleries is FREE (excluding IMAX and Special Exhibits). The Hollywood Bowl Museum provides **FREE** tours for groups of 10 or more, immersing you in a unique, behind-the-scenes experience. Complete with a walk backstage and on-stage, when circumstances allow, the tour also takes you on a visit to the Museum as well as to the top of the seating area for a picturesque view of the Hollywood sign. Strolling the grounds during the day, when the Bowl is empty of concertgoers, gives you an unfettered view of the venue's grand scale. On **Tuesdays**, **Thursdays**, or **Fridays** during the busy concert season (June to September), visitors are able to watch a rehearsal by the LA Philharmonic or Hollywood Bowl Orchestra, instead of going backstage. If this is of interest, please mention it when booking your tour.

Robertson Public Library - Summer Reading Club is a great way to combat summer slide by keeping children's reading skills sharp over the summer. All of our 73 Los Angeles Public Libraries will have free programs, activities and prizes that encourage children to read over the summer. 

2019 Dues are Due

Thanks to all of our neighbors who have paid their dues to date. Names of neighbors whose dues are paid by April 30 will appear on the 2018-2019 Roster. NU Rosters are made available only to neighbors on your specific block whose dues are paid. This is useful in emergencies and also helps to get to know your neighbors. Block Captains receive a complete roster. For the privacy of our neighbors, rosters are not to be shared with anyone outside of our community.

Our 2019 membership dues of \$20 are due and payable now. (Neighbors who are 80+ years old are exempt from dues; however, to receive the newsletter, you must complete a membership form and note that you are 80+ so we will know. Your age will not be made public.)

Your dues cover the cost of renting our meeting place, post office box, printing newsletters, postage, and other miscellaneous expenses. Newsletters are available to all of our neighbors who have paid dues. The names of neighbors whose dues are paid will appear on our membership roster, which is developed for the sole benefit of our community.
