July's Guest Speaker

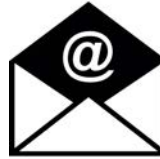
Ready for Obama Boulevard?

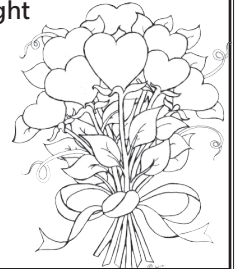
