Hanukkah commemorates the victory of the ancient Israelites over the Syrian Greek army, and the subsequent miracle of restoring the menorah in the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. The miracle of Hanukkah is that only one vial of oil was found with just enough oil for one day, and yet it lasted for eight full days.

We extend our heartfelt best wishes to our friends and neighbors as you celebrate. We hope you will join us to share stories of this beautiful holiday.

Kwanzaa is a week-long holiday honoring African culture and traditions. It falls between December 26 and January 1 each year. Maulana Karenga, an African-American professor, proposed this observance and it was first celebrated 50 years ago. It is not a religious holiday and is not intended to replace Christmas. It is largely a private celebration observed by individuals, families and local communities.

LAPD Has an Important Holiday Message for The Community!

As Holiday Season 2016 gets into full swing, here are some tips to help you have a safe and joyous holiday season.

LAPD asks you to secure your vehicles and do not leave anything of value inside. There has been an increase of burglary from motor vehicles inside apartment parking garages. Don't allow people to enter apartment parking garages behind you and lock your vehicles. Also,

- Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or family member.
- Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.
- Stay alert to your surroundings.
- Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "con-artists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

Holiday Time is Here: Time for Gift Giving and GIFT TAKING

We've heard a great deal lately about "Porch Pirates" stealing packages from porches after deliveries are made. One of our neighbors shared a photo of a thief in our neighborhood.

The news media and police agencies have made several suggestions for us to protect ourselves from these unscrupulous bandits. Also many businesses have developed products that they say will help.

Some suggestions if you can't be home to personally receive a delivery are:

- Check with your employer to see if they would be willing to let you have your package delivered at work;
- Check with neighbors who may home to leave packages at a location where someone can actually accept them;
- UPS offers a free service called UPS My Choice, which alerts users about deliveries. It also expanded its Access Point network, which delivers packages to be dropped at thousands of local businesses.
- FedEx recently introduced an app that lets people customize home delivery.

Also as alert neighbors, if we get to know our neighbors, we can retrieve packages left openly on porches and give them to our neighbors when they get home. That's part of "Neighborhood Watch".
