As part of a recent LAPD reorganization, Rolando Solano was appointed as the new Captain at LAPD's Wilshire Division. He is replacing Captain Leslie who recently transferred to Central Division. Captain Solano joined the Los Angeles Police Department in April 1990, and has held assignments at Foothill, Van Nuys and Central Divisions where he worked patrol, foot beats, and vice assignments. During his tour of duty in Central Vice, he initiated abatement proceedings against several drug and prostitution ridden motels. These abatements eventually cleared the area for the establishment of the Staples Center/LA Live entertainment properties. He served as an element member for a crime suppression platoon in Metropolitan Division where he received the Police Commission Meritorious Unit Citation for teamwork during his deployment at the "North Hollywood Bank of America Robbery".

Proposed Mixed Use-100 Unit Apartment - Update



Mark your calendars and plan to attend the PICO NC Land Use Committee meeting on Thursday, April 21 for an update on the proposed mixed-use development at 6116-6144 W. Pico Boulevard. The proposal is to build a 100-unit apartment complex over ground floor retail space. A hearing is tentatively set for Friday, May 6.

Last month we asked neighbors to write comments to the Los Angeles Planning Department regarding an application for a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) submitted by developers for the proposed project. Also a letter was sent on behalf of Neighbors United citing concerns expressed at our meeting with the developer's representative. We encourage <u>all</u> community members who are concerned to attend the upcoming meeting. Your input is critical if we are to stop or modify this project.

Earth Day



Earth Day is an annual day on which events are held worldwide to demonstrate support for environmental protection. It is observed on April 22 each year. The April 22 date was designated as International Mother Earth Day by a consensus resolution adopted by the United Nations in 2009. Earth Day is now coordinated globally by the Earth Day Network (EDN), and is celebrated in more than 192 countries every year.

Friday, April 22nd, the first in our five-year countdown to Earth Day's 50th: Earth Day 2020! The theme for Earth Day 2016 is "Trees for the Earth!" Our planet is currently losing over 15 billion trees each year due to deforestation, land development, and bad forest management (that is roughly 48 football fields every minute). EDN is announcing Trees for the Earth (#Trees4Earth), a plan to plant 7.8 billion trees by Earth Day's 50th in 2020. That is one tree for every person on the planet! Trees for the Earth will focus on those regions of the world most affected by deforestation. However, we can help by planting and maintaining the health of our community trees.

Neighbors Watching Out for Neighbors

Do you know what good neighbors do? They watch out for each other. Recently on two occasions "knock-knock" burglars decided to test a couple of houses. In one incident they actually got in, but thanks to good neighbors, police were called immediately and caught one of them. Looks like one got away.

An alert neighborhood made it known that the person was being watched and he called the police. The potential intruder turned and walked swiftly away and headed toward the Kaiser parking lot where LAPD close behind.

Kudos to those alert neighbors. This is what you call NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH!
